Hepburn Energy (formerly Hepburn Wind) is Australia's first community-owned co-operative wind farm, operating for over a decade. Hepburn Energy is now developing solar and battery projects and deploys bulk buys to support the communities transition to zero-net emissions by 2030.



Hepburn Z-NET is a collaborative partnership bringing together community groups, organisations, experts and council to shift the Hepburn Shire to zero-net energy by 2025 and zero-net emissions by 2030. Hepburn Z-NET has been working together across the Shire since 2019.

We are a U-Pick farm with a focus on waste reduction and sustainable farming practices.

Hepburn Gardens for Wildlife (HG4W) is a unique partnership between the local community, Hepburn Shire Council and the Neighbourhood Centres across the shire. HG4W works with the community on Dja Dja Wurrung Country to increase our knowledge, understanding of and support for wildlife and habitat creation. “SHIFT stands for Sustainable Healthy Integrated Food Towns. SHIFT is a community-based integrated healthy food-farming social enterprise with a focus on mental health and wellbeing, child and youth wellbeing, healthy food system, and sustainability. Our first project is the SHIFT Healthy Lunch Kitchen, a social enterprise launched in March 2021 at the Daylesford Primary School, now reaching 50% of primary schools across Hepburn Shire with affordable healthy lunches, using local produce. The SHIFT Young Growers (YG) Project provides priority young people 16-25 years with pathways to education, and employment in horticulture. YG integrates learning, with paid jobs, a volunteer network, and growing of produce for the Healthy Lunch Kitchen. The first SHIFT Traineeship has recently been established”.



Hepburn Shire Storm Recovery



Hepburn Shire's Sustainability and Storm Recovery teams are partnering with community to deliver the inaugural Sustainable Hepburn Expo Day

The Storm Recovery Team was established to assist with clean up from the June 2021 storm which impacted large parts of Victoria and more locally, Trentham and surrounding areas in the Hepburn Shire.

Thanks to funding provided by Australian and State Governments, the team conducted impact assessments, ran firewood and fencepost programs and held mental wellbeing events. The current program is jointly funded by the Australian Government and the Department of Families, Fairness and Housing under the Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements and is focussed on regeneration, sustainability and resilience with programs such as chainsaw training and habitat and wildlife programs, which aim to raise awareness and skills within the community as well as improving networks to neighbours and the greater community.

One of the themes of the Sustainable Hepburn strategy is Climate Resilience which sets out the following objectives:

- The Hepburn community is better connected, prepared and engaged for climate related impacts
- Hepburn Shire Council is better prepared for climate related impacts
- Re-localise Hepburn Shire: improve security of basic needs for locals from locals
- Ensure intergenerational equity of resources across Hepburn Shire
