What is e-waste?

Electrical waste is any item with a battery, cord or plug. It can not be disposed of in your kerbside bins. Small items can be taken to our Council Customer Service hubs or libraries (smaller than a kettle) but large items need to be taken to the transfer stations.

E-waste that is in working order and passes a test and tag test is able to be resold in the resource recovery shops, aka Tip shops, at our transfer stations.
